The No 1 Slip Cradle

The refurbished and strengthened No 1 slip cradle is back in action and is working well. The new rubber bumpers on the arms were found to have too much grip and were replaced by the Tuesday boys and Rob Besson with a marine carpet buffer which allows boats to slip more easily into place.

Please note the ratchet levers work in a slightly different sense to previously the pink on one side of the ratchets now face east to tighten the arms.

Slip Operators Required

Four Members have responded to the call for more slip operators and are undergoing training. A great co-operative spirit.

Ramp Users please note

The demon rust caused the need to replace the boom gate and a new boom gate has been installed. To open the gate press <u>down on it as you swipe with your key tag</u> and lift the gate. When closing the boom gate press down firmly and ensure it locks into place.

Future Marina Expansion

The response to the circular sent to Members prior to the AGM was positive.

This was also discussed at the AGM and the Members present supported the idea of looking at the possibility and requested the Board obtain ballpark figures as to the costs involved and funding for discussion at the February GM.

Dinghies tie down in Dinghy racks

Members with a dinghy in the club's Dinghy racks are requested to ensure they are securely tied so that they will not fall out or be blown out by the wind. Noise from a loose dinghy when the wind is up is also very annoying to neighbours and our tenants.

Noise outside normal working hours

Following a neighbour's complaint about noise from the Club outside reasonable working hours on a Saturday and Sunday Members are reminded about the Noise By-law No6 C which states:

BY-LAW NO. 6C - NOISE

Members should be aware at all times that the Club is located in a residential area. When Members are working on Club premises, on their boats, on the slips, and or work berth the following applies:

- 1. Water blasting of boats is allowed from 8am to 5pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 1pm Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays.
- 2. Water blasting of boat is limited to 30 minutes.
- 3. Prolonged intermittent (on/off) use of water blaster is not allowed.
- 4. Constant power tools noise is limited to 1pm, Saturday or on Sunday and public holidays.
- 5. Excessive noise is unacceptable
