Long Vessels and Slip #1

All Members using slip #1 are reminded it is absolutely essential to ensure that no antifoul wash runoff enters Winnererremy Bay. All Members need to ensure that if a vessel's antifoul wash up does not fall above the collection grate the skirt must be used to prevent fouling the bay.

Users of the water blaster should always blast areas around the stern of their vessel so as to blast in the direction of the bow of the vessel and not in the direction of the Winnererremy Bay. If any Member sees any indiscretion in this regard please draw it to the attention of the operator immediately.

Water blaster operators are reminded to set themselves up so as to blast about a third of their boat without stopping. It is the continued on and off use of the water blaster that most upsets our neighbours.
