Casey Van Dyke has been negotiating with one of our neighbours adjacent to the yard regarding removal of a large and dangerous tree which partly overhangs our yard. There is also another overhanging tree which needs pruning. All this will be undertaken at our neighbour's expense and liability. It will obviously be to our benefit as well as a lot of the leaves and branches find their way into our yard and on to members' boats. We will be asking the owners of boats in yard spots 10-15 to temporarily move their boats to the club house yard or with their permission we can do it for them.

How Would You Like This?

Recently a member with a work berth booking arrived at 0800 hrs. to tie up and work on their boat. The boat owned by the previous occupant, which should have should have been moved out the previous evening was still there. Although the owner arrived to move it out, Murphy's law prevailed (engine would not start) and was unable to vacate until around 1000 hrs. Not good! The moral (and the rule) is, if you are occupying the work berth please vacate in the evening prior to the next person coming in. This will enable your successor in the berth to come in first thing in the morning and start work. It is a good idea to get the contact details of your successor on the work berth prior to your tenure in case there is an unexpected problem. You can then call them and work something out. Remember with the new electronic PAC Booking System looking at it two days before and see the following day after your stay vacant and then assume no one is following your stay in the work berth is not good enough, people are booking the work berth the night before and even on the day.

Is There A Paramedic On Board?

There just nine spaces left for the first aid training course will be held on the 27th August from 9am to 3pm. The course will be run by a trainer who is a currently a serving paramedic. The members doing this course will graduate qualified and confident in giving first aid as well as the use of the defibrillator. If you attended the 2014 courses this is an excellent opportunity to be recertified and achieve a higher level of competency.

The cost is a mere \$50 which includes a light lunch. It takes a few hours of home study and about 6 hrs training on the day in August. PAC is subsidising the cost. This figure is most reasonable as a St John's one day course is around \$200.

The course is open to Members their partners and immediate family. (Immediate family means Members parents or children)

Marina Committee Update

The aim of the committee has been to prepare itself to make a submission to the review of the Pittwater Waterways currently being prepared by Council. In November/December 2015 the Council met with several different groups including the Marina operators, which the PAC attended, to gain an understanding of the uses and parameters of Pittwater to create a review

document. This review document will be released by Council in mid-2016. When released the Club will then be making a submission.

To prepare for this submission the Marina Committee has approached companies to quote to do a survey of the proposed area and of the seagrass and water quality. If any member has a contact in this area that they would recommend please contact the Secretary at paqclub@tpg.com.au. From the quotes currently received the estimated spend on these activities is \$7,500 which is within the range of \$10,000 in the original estimate. It is hoped that at the general meeting we will be able to announce the Surveys have commenced.

At this time no further thought or sketches have been done on the shape of the marina pontoons, though the committee has received very useful feedback from members on this topic. On receipt of surveys in principal agreements will be sought from Fisheries, Maritime and Lands Department. The committee is also looking at the engagement of a technical expert to assist with the process and documentation as we commence the council process. A further update will be provided at the upcoming General Meeting and there will also be an opportunity for members to ask questions, or members can forward your questions now to paqclub@tpg.com.au. so answers can be prepared.

Cowan Creek to Broken Bay

We don't often get to see this lovely body of water from this vantage point. Cottage Point and the entrance to Coal and Candle Creek is in foreground right and Lion Island is in the distance. At top left is the entrance to Jerusalem Bay which is sheltered from everything but a strong easterly. The water is fairly deep but with plenty of scope makes a good anchorage. Don't venture too close to the end of the bay as it suddenly gets very shallow with some nasty rocks. As you enter Jerusalem Bay on the left hand side is Pinta Bay. There are three public moorings in Pinta and the fishing there is usually excellent. It is so peaceful there it is difficult to realise that you are so close to the Sydney metropolitan area with a freeway just over the escarpment.
