Fellow co-op members, we recently received a note from Brian Hunter that he has retired from Sydney and the PAC. As a quiet achiever Brian has made some significant contributions to our co-op including editing and publishing the PAC Newsletter. He sat on the board during that extremely controversial period when we ultimately decided to build our new clubhouse. He then pitched in (like many) in the physical work associated with the clubhouse. Brian was one of the few people to teach me how to operate the slipways and he was pretty good at slipping some of the more awkward boats. I am grateful to Brian for all of the help that he freely offered. Following Brian's move to warmer climes we find ourselves shorthanded on the slipways. We are getting dangerously close to the point where members will be unable to slip their boats due to the lack of slip operators. Consider this; our club is founded on the spirit of co-operation and we are a community of "do-it-yourselfers". The vast majority of boat owners in this COOPERATIVE should be able to slip a boat. If every boat owner was a slip operator we would have a far greater chance of finding a slip operator when we need one. Secondly — it's FUN. I've made many new friends through slipping boats. You can get involved by checking out the slip booking system, find when a boat is being slipped, call the owner to confirm the time and then come down to the club and observe and learn. Before you know it you will be having more fun at PAC.

Do you keep your boat trailer on the street?

At the 2nd May 2016 meeting Pittwater Council (as it was) agreed to a recommendation to conduct a three month pilot programme being undertaken by the Office of Local Government to implement the Impounding Amendment (Unattended Boat Trailers) Act 2015. The legislation will apply from 1st July 2016. These changes will allow Council to impound a boat trailer if it has not been moved for at least 28 days and the owner has not complied with a notice to move it within 15 days. This legislation only applies to boat trailers and not campervans.

With comments back on the 5th Draft the 6th Draft has now been updated to the website. Thanks to those members that have sent in feedback and all have been sent a response. The Club has received notification from the Registrar of updates to the Registrar's template as a result of feedback from other Co-operatives going through the same processes we are. Marina Committee Update

The aim of the committee has been to prepare itself to make a submission to the review of the Pittwater Waterways currently being prepared by Council. In November/December 2015 the Council met with several different groups including the Marina operators, which the PAC attended, to gain an understanding of the uses and parameters of Pittwater to create a review document. This review document will be released by Council in mid-2016. When released the Club will then be making a submission.

To prepare for this submission the Marina Committee has approached companies to quote to do a survey of the proposed area and of the seagrass and water quality. If any member has a contact in this area that they would recommend please contact the Secretary at <u>paqclub@tpg.com.au</u>. From the quotes currently received the estimated spend on these activities is \$7,500 which is within the range of \$10,000 in the original estimate. It is hoped that at the general meeting we will be able to announce the Surveys have commenced.

At this time no further thought or sketches have been done on the shape of the marina pontoons, though the committee has received very useful feedback from members on this topic. On receipt of surveys an in principal agreements will be sought from Fisheries, Maritime and Lands Department. The committee is also looking at the engagement of a technical expert to assist with the process and documentation as we commence the council process. A further update will be provided at the upcoming General Meeting and there will also be an opportunity for members to ask questions, or members can forward your questions now to paqclub@tpg.com.au so answers can be prepared.
