Marina Committee Update

The Marina Committee has requested quotes from four surveyors and select one to proceed with the Land and water survey covering the area of the proposed marina extension. A separate surveyor has been selected to report on the seagrass and possible containments in the seabed which could be disturbed with the construction process. The quote for these services is in line with the budgeted amount announced of \$10,000. This update was also provided at the General Meeting where members had further questions. The configuration of the marina has not been

addressed at this stage but any member who has a view on this matter should be putting their thoughts in writing to the Secretary <u>paqclub@tpg.com.au</u>.

Annual General Meeting

The AGM was well attended this year and as mentioned, well catered with thanks going to June Wilson and Ron Baxter. There was a pause for Berry Innes who recently passed away before the President welcomed the new members and acknowledged our most recent life member Rob Besson.

The formal part of the meeting commenced and the four current directors nominated were elected for another term. John Wynen proposal to increase the directors remuneration to \$1,300 was supported by the meeting and the directors gave there reports for the year ended 31 March 2016. Noel Phelan's report on the use of club facilities indicated all were fully allocated except Dinghy and runabout storage where there are currently some vacancies. Lindsay Holloway brought to the meetings attention the level of maintenance required to keep the Clubhouse and surrounds in such a great condition, also acknowledging the outstanding work of the Tuesday Boys who recently completed the shed over the sewage pumps and slip pits. Casey Van Dyke reported on the requirement for members to be prompt and diligent in there requirement to complete and send in MVD's forms when there are changes to their vessel details. This requirement gives all members the confidence that other member's vessels are correctly registered and insured and minimises the risk to the Clubs and all other members' assets. Casey went on to discuss the progress of the CNL committee and that the Rules are now at the stage where Co-operative Registrar approval will be sought, prior to the new CNL Rules being presented to the members for them to vote on the adoption of the CNL Rules or not. Richard updated the meeting on the progress of Marina Committee and announced the selection of the Surveyors for the project. A page of questions were received in advance from Brian Smith and after the Secretary gave some summary answers to the meeting a handout was passed to all members present with the questions and prepared answers. If any member wishes to receive a copy please email the Secretary. In Other Business the issue of access to the work berth and recent damage to vessels was raised. Access is often made difficult by the moored vessel immediately west of the entrance to the work berth. The meeting was advised of the discussions that had been had with the BSO from Maritime and that the PAC has been in correspondence with and received advice from the relevant owner that he is "working with Waterways towards moving to another mooring over the coming weeks".

New Member

The final new member for the 2016 -2017 year was inducted. Josephine Le, whose nomination was supported by long time and recently retired member Warren Jackson, was shown the 'ropes', received her burgee and welcomed into the Club. This puts the current membership at 408 including Life members.

Grant Application

Some months back it was announced the club had filed an application for grant funding from the NSW sport and recreation budget. Unfortunately our grant application was not accepted and as a result the club was not allocated any funds.

Club By-laws and Rules

One of the roles expected of the Board by the members is that the Rules of the Club are being followed by its members and the Board has a responsibility to continue to educate members on the Rules. The Board does from time to time write or contact members for breaches of Rules but it must be said that the majority of members do practice the Rules.

This Journal and the previous PAC Newsletter has had a dedicated section to remind members about a Rule. This month the By-law being focused on is Safety:

Members are requested to think safety at all times, particularly while on Club premises. Our Members come from all walks of life, a wide group of ages and possess widely varying skills. There may at any time be non-member guests, including children, who are unfamiliar with the hazards associated with an active "DIY" Club like the PAC. It is up to each of us to practice safety consciousness and vigilance while on Club premises. It may be easy to overlook such things in an environment which fosters fun and enjoyment, but the costs of an entirely avoidable serious accident can be devastating.

SYCC

There are several PAC club members who are also members of the Small Yacht Cruising Club (SYCC) and the Club has had an affiliation with this organisation over many years allowing access to the clubhouse for their meetings. The SYCC is currently welcoming new members. SYCC is a small group of like-minded sailors, who enjoy cruising and socialising on the beautiful waterways of Pittwater, Broken Bay and beyond. Members own a variety of yachts such as Catalina, Bavaria, Jeaneau, Phantom, DuFour and others. They range up to 44 feet. There is no club house but quarterly meetings are held at the PAC. A fortnightly program of events include in-shore and off-shore sailing and non-sailing activities. The club has 7 moorings in Pittwater and Cowan Creek. It is a very affordable sailing club and the joining fee has been waived for new members until the end of September 2016.
