



Spill kits

Two spill kits have been purchased. Each has the same contents. The floating containment boom can be easily joined with the integrated snap hooks to form a larger boom if required. There are pads to soak up any contaminants such as oil and these are to be disposed of in the special bags that are provided. Please use the gloves that are provided when handling any contaminants.

This 240L Marine Spill Kit is ideal for all oil and petroleum spills on land and water. Packed full of premium absorbents, it is ideal for spills in marinas .

Contents include:

- 1 x 240L Yellow Wheelie Bin
- 100 x Oil only absorbent pads
- 3 x bags LiquaSweep X700 absorbent (will float on water and absorb oils spills)
- 4 x 3m x 125mm marine booms (snap hook join)
- 2 prs 45cm PVC Gloves
- 8 Biodegradable Waste Disposal Bags
- 8 Ties
- 1 x Security Tag
